

Meet Your New Wyndhaven TAP

The East end of town just got more stylish. Not only do we now have a Meier and Frank and REI stores—REI—now we've arrived! ...But Apartment F260, AKA the Wyndhaven Technology Access Point, is set up and almost ready to go prime time.

Located at Baseline and 185th, Wyndhaven is a new 400 unit complex tucked in next to the MAX station, and in an enclave bordering jurisdictions of Beaverton, Hillsboro, and MAX.

The plan, under auspices and support of Commander Reimann, is to create a multi-purpose TAP. Donated by Wyndhaven, the one-bedroom apartment's living room houses the 12 station Linux lab; and the back bedroom area contains the server, printer, and officer work area. HPD put in a cypher lock on the front door, and each participating department (HPD, BPD, MAX, and WCSO) will have its own unique entry code for the facility, in addition to Wyndhaven management and the PRS technical support volunteers.

So...what we have here is a build-out if another phase of meeting the Hillsboro2020 Visioning [Strategy 44.1](#) of providing effective community policing and outreach to the underprivileged. Wyndhaven encompasses approximately 70% Section 8 housing. An exciting aspect is that these apartments also have blocks

designated as Intel temporary housing—which raises the opportunity to not only “bridge the digital divide,” but to substantially staff the TAP with on-site volunteers. To this end, Wyndhaven will be putting out flyers announcing the TAP opening, and encouraging occupants (especially Intel employees) to volunteer to work there.

Volunteer Coordinator Bertha Martel, and Intel's Perry Gruber will work to optimize this partnership.
